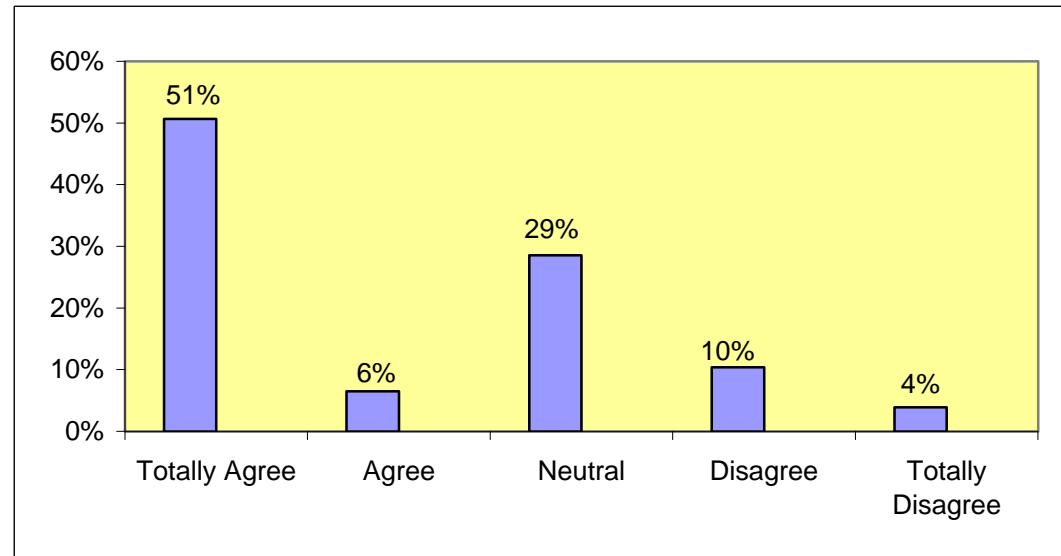


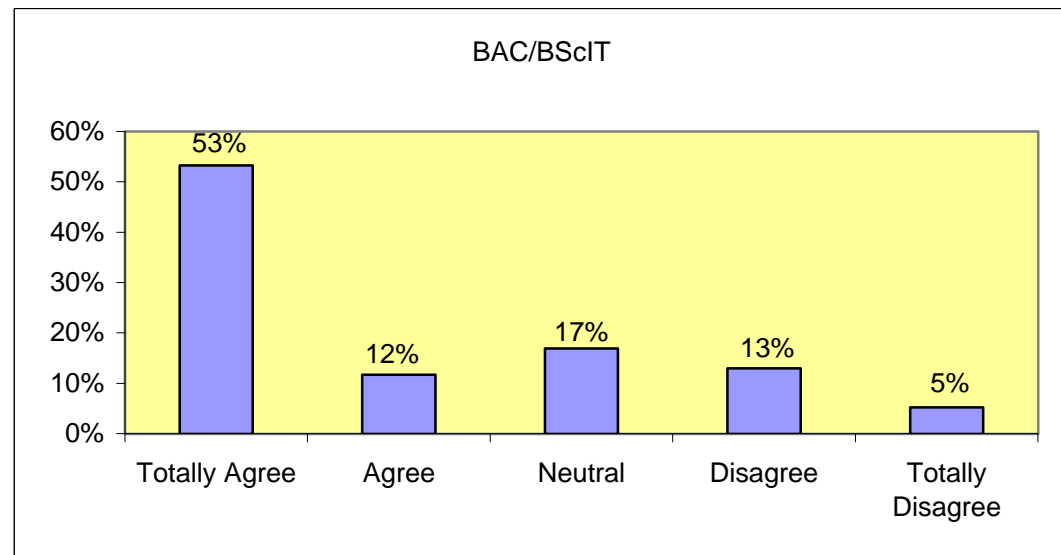
Question 1 : Your overall industrial placement experience is useful to you

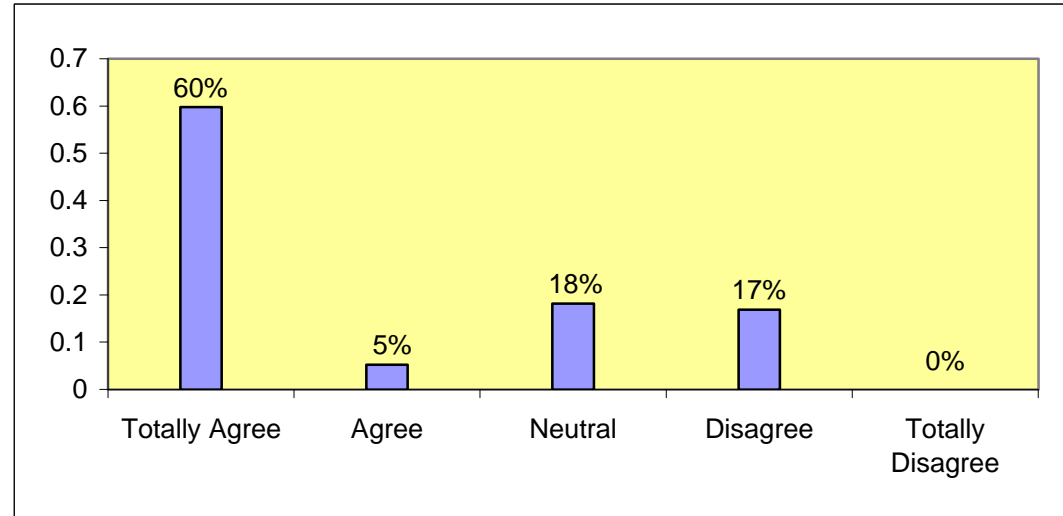
Question 2 : You learned new and important technical skills during your placement training

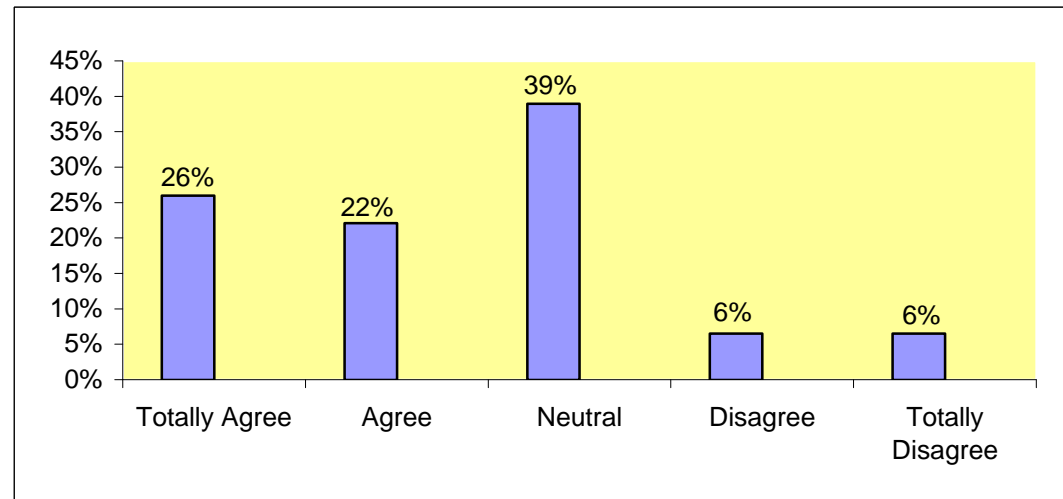

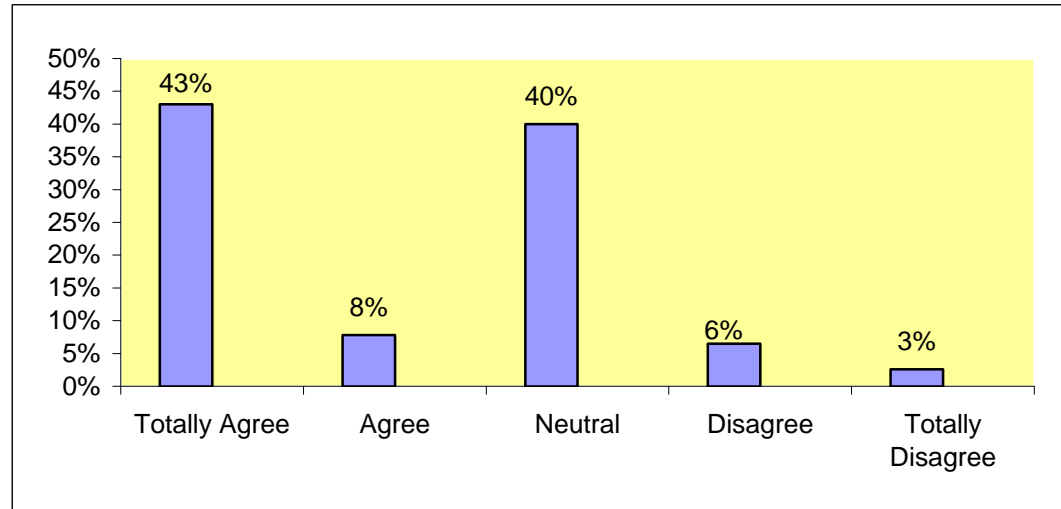

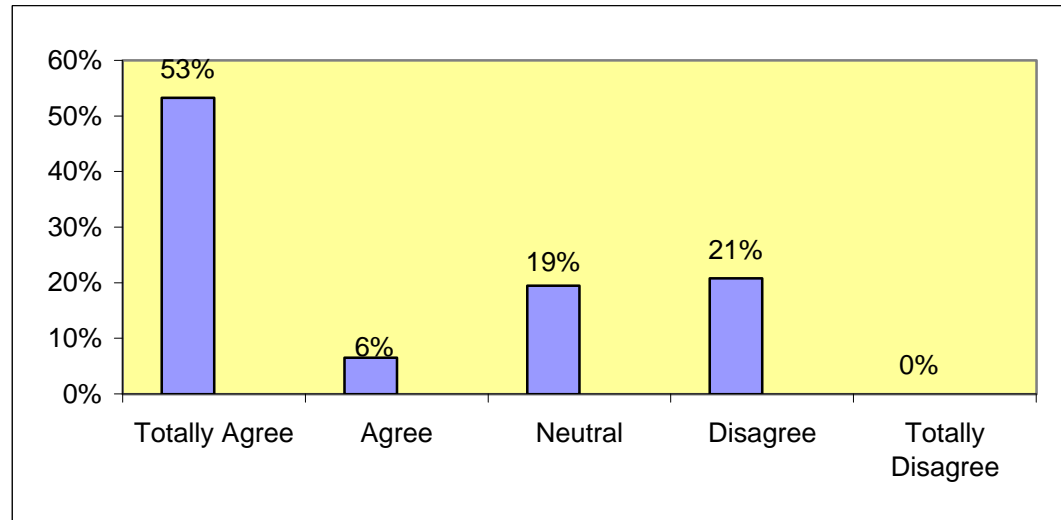
Question 5 : Your placement training helps you decide what you want to do with your future career

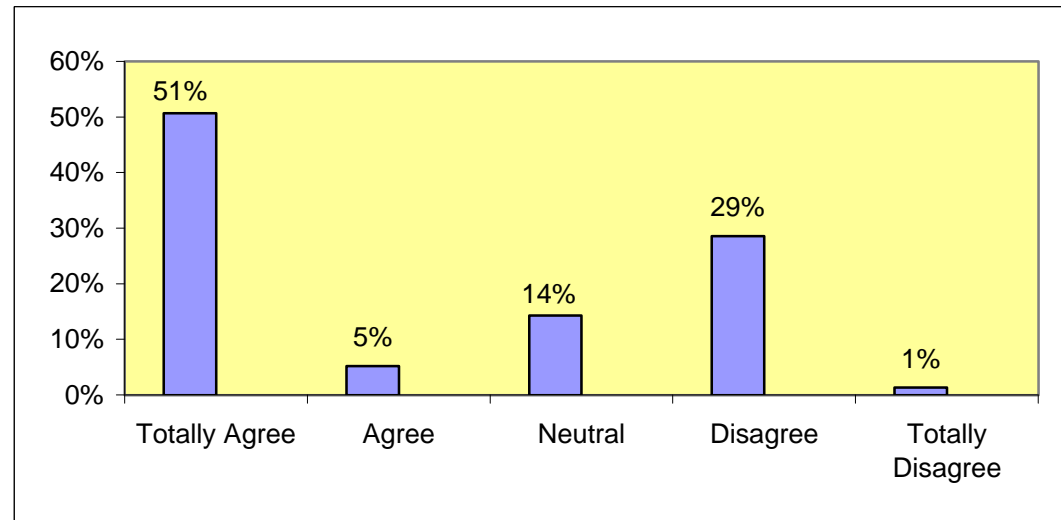
Question 6 : You maintained a good relationship with your supervisors at work

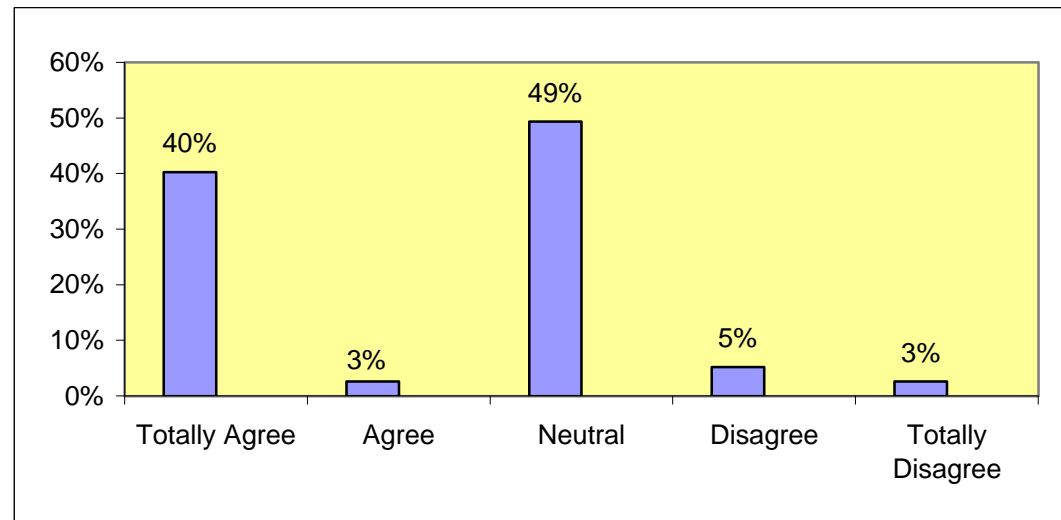
Question 7 : You maintained a good relationship with your peer colleagues at work

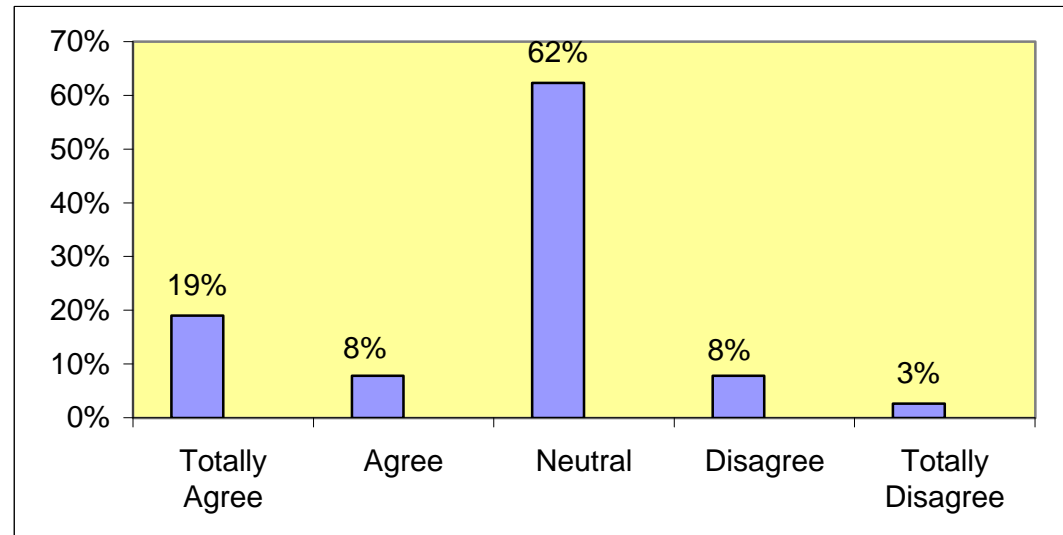
Question 8 : You maintained a good relationship with your clients at work

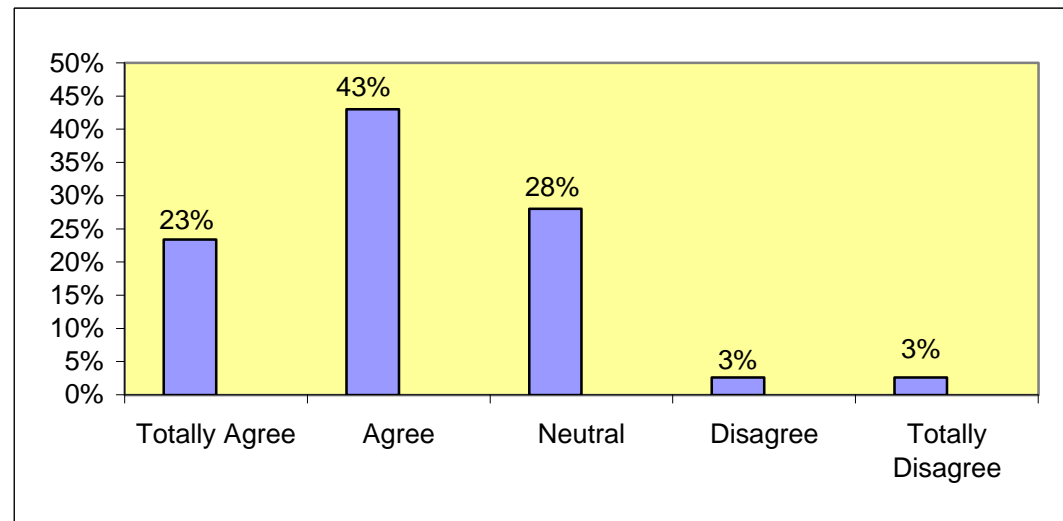
Question 9 : Your supervisors at work would like to hire you back after graduation

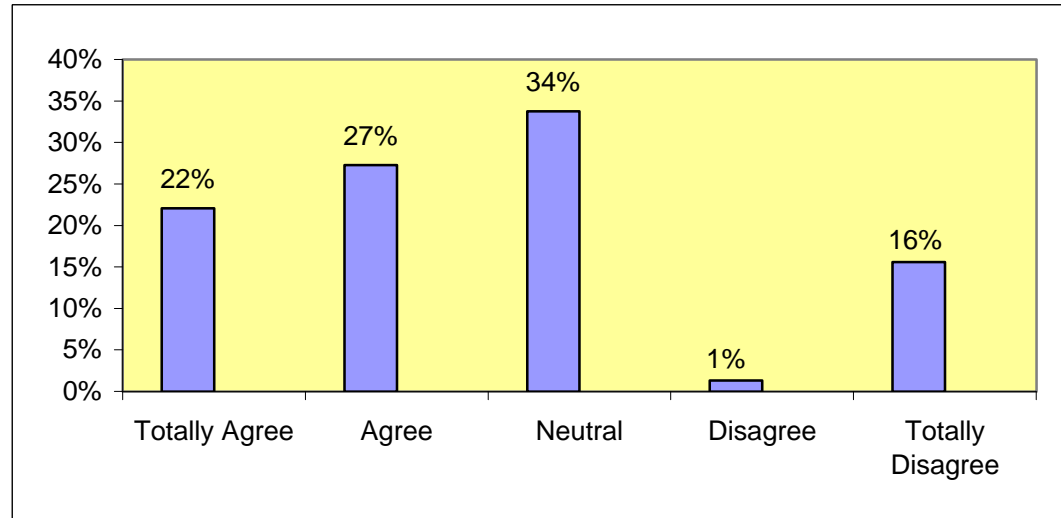
Question 10 : You learned most of the technical skills required for your placement position just before starting your placement

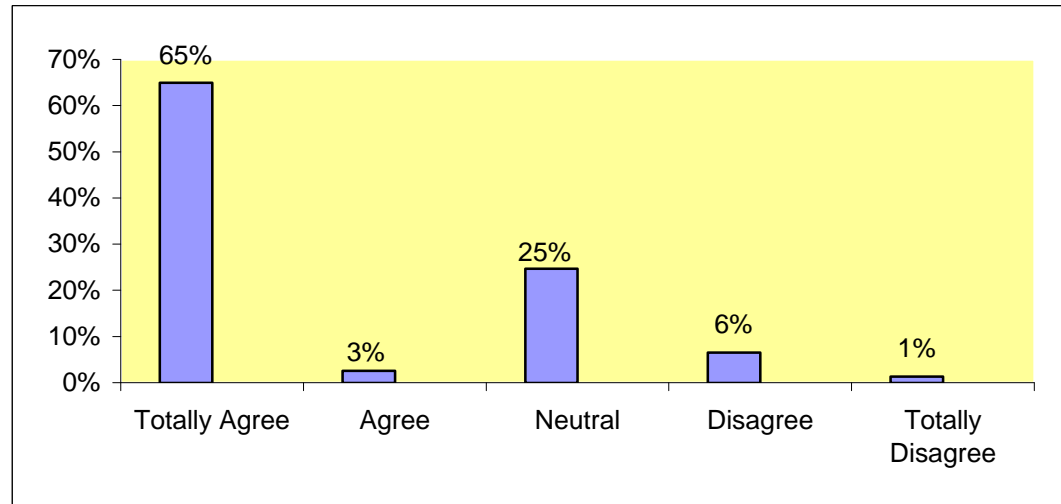
Question 11 : Your first two years of education helped you pick up new technologies and technical skills required for your placement position

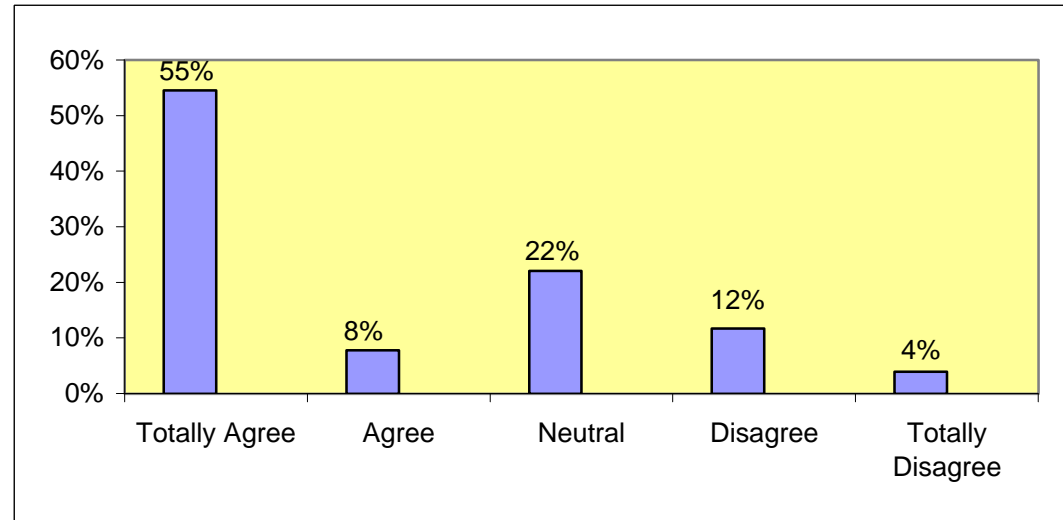
Question 12 : You were able to pick up the technical skills required for your placement position within the first two months of employment

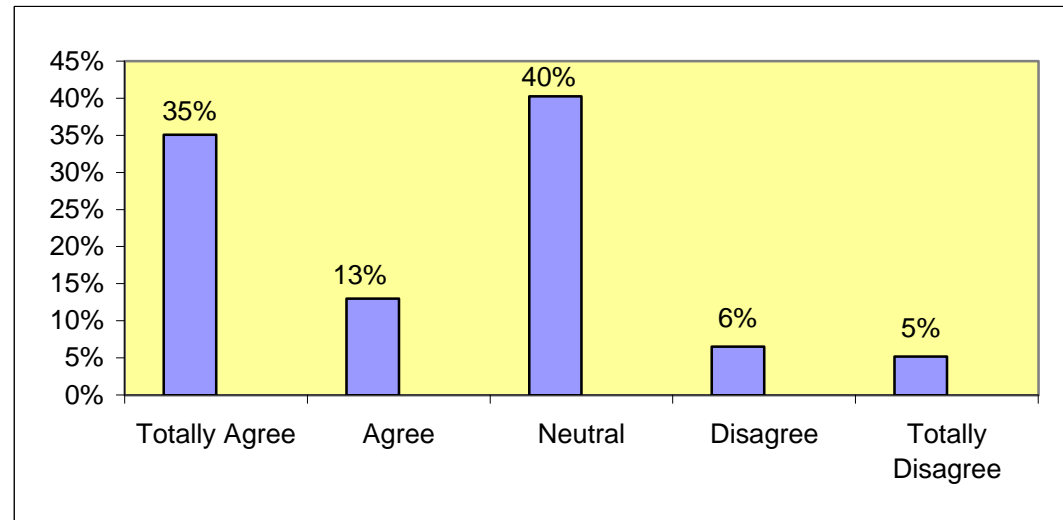

Question 3: Other comments and suggestions to improve the placement program
